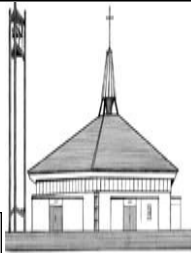

### A life full of grace

The prayers of humanity are closely linked to the sentiment of awe. The greatness of humanity is infinitesimal compared to the dimensions of the universe. While even an individual's greatest conquests may seem minor, the individual is not an insignificant being. In prayer, a sentiment of mercy is powerfully affirmed.
