

### LENT

Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Almsgiving means putting aside money for the poor, and contributing it to Trócaire. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. On Ash Wednesday we receive ashes on our foreheads, as we enter into this time established for the purification of our souls. The ashes is an outward sign of our human condition as sinners. By receiving the ashes we are expressing our desire for interior conversion. We receive ashes in a spirit of hope; hope that the lord will be merciful. This is the first step on the way to the celebration of The Sacrament of Penance in the days before Easter. Ash Wednesday is to be observed as a day of Penance in the whole Church. It is a fast day and a day of abstinence.
