Parish Funeral Ministry The Diocesan Parish Pastoral Council is offering 3 nights training for Parishes that would like to develop a funeral Ministry team in their Parish. The idea would be that a minimum of 4 people would be trained to assist families in their journey through bereavement with the loss of a loved one. This would include Meeting with the family of the bereaved. Preparing the Liturgy for the Funeral Mass/ Service. Leading prayers in the presence of the body in the family home, funeral home, Church. Accompanying the family during the funeral Mass. They have requested the Parish Pastoral Councils in Cloone & Aughavas to identify & invite 4 people from each Parish to attend 3 nights of training that will be given in The Family Life Centre, Teallach Íosa, St Mel's Road, Longford on Wed 30th Sept, Wed 7th and 14th October @ 7pm. In preparation, the Pastoral Councils are inviting people of the parishes to let any member of the Parish Council know if they would be prepared to attend the training. Also if you know someone from Cloone or Aughavas whom you feel would be suitable for this work, please approach them and ask them to put their names forward. It is very important that the Parishes send 4 people from each Parish to this training. It is a positive response to the scarcity of priests & the enabling of Lay Catholics to take on some of the Ministry which is presently done by priests, or was formerly done by priests.

Saint Barry of Cloone One night as St Fraoch looked out from his monastic cell, legend has it that he observed a falling star or meteor in the western sky over his sister Finnmaith's dwelling in Gort na Luachra. He saw this as a sign of heavenly graces bestowed on the baby which had just been born and the young child was subsequently brought to him for his early education in the monastery at Cloone. The place of his birth was recorded as a place of pilgrimage up to famine times and its location has recently been marked again. Barry or Berach was later sent for further education to Saint Kevin at Glendalough before beginning his own missionary travels. Barry fulfilled his uncle's aspirations for him as he founded many monasteries across the country such as Kilbarack, Dublin, Cill Barróg (Church of young Barry), Kilberry Church of Barry, Co. Meath, and there is also some evidence that he may have done missionary work in Scotland where a place called Kilberry in Argyll bears his name. Undoubtedly his most famous monastery and the place where he is buried is at Tarmonbarry, Co Roscommon. Legend has it that he built his monastery there at a place he named Cluain Coirpthe The (meadow of corruption) because of a number of dead bodies which he found on his arrival there. Here he finally fulfilled St Patricks prophecy that a great saint would come from the violent Conmaicne clan and finally convert this warlike tribe to Christianity. He died around 595 AD and his feast day is on February 15th.
